Hagee held slave auctions to raise money for his Texas church, referred to the Catholic Church as a "false cult system," and made sexist comments that drew widespread criticism from women's groups across the country. On national radio, Hagee recently said that Hurricane Katrina was God's way of punishing New Orleans for being a sinful city that was scheduled to hold a gay parade. And John McCain recently cut off all ties with Hagee after he said that the Holocaust was part of God's plan to force reluctant Jews to go to Israel.

Hagee opposes a two-state solution between Israelis and Palestinians or any territorial compromise, he uses his influence with conservative Republicans to undermine any efforts by the U.S. to advance peace, and his organization provides funding to illegal Israeli settlements throughout the West Bank.
