Q.34 As you may know, on a few occasions during the past 13 years, Israeli, Palestinian, and American negotiators came close to reaching a final status peace agreement but ultimately fell short. The details of that agreement include:

- a demilitarized Palestinian state in the West Bank and Gaza

- international forces to monitor the new Palestinian state and border crossings
