

J Street 2022 National Election Survey

November 2022

- Conducted November 1-8, 2022
- 800 self-identified Jews who voted in the 2022 election, including voters who cast their vote on Election Day and before Election Day
 - Survey sample drawn from a national voter file, consisting of all registered voters in the United States
 - Voters contacted via text, and then took survey on their phone or computer
 - Respondents were asked whether they consider themselves Jewish, using the same question wording used by Pew Research Center
 - All respondents self-reported that they had already voted
- Margin of error: +/- 3.5 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence level

Key Findings

- In a very polarized and evenly divided political environment, Jewish voters remain firmly entrenched in the Democratic camp and voted for the Democratic Congressional candidate by a 74 to 25 percent margin.
- The state of democracy (55 percent) and abortion (40 percent) were the dominant issues for Jewish voters in the election, and they share Biden's and the Democratic Party's worldview.
 - Biden has a 70 percent job approval.
 - The Democratic Party has a 66 percent favorable/32 percent unfavorable rating.
- Trump and Republicans are deeply unpopular with Jewish voters.
 - Trump has a 20 percent favorable/79 percent unfavorable rating.
 - The GOP has a 22 percent favorable/76 percent unfavorable rating.
 - McConnell has an 11 percent favorable/85 percent unfavorable rating.


- Jewish voters express major concerns about antisemitism in the United States (85 percent very concerned; 12 percent somewhat concerned), and 76 percent view Trump and his Republican allies as responsible for the rise in antisemitism.
- Trump and the MAGA movement are viewed by 74 percent as a threat to Jews in America.
- In this environment where Jews' top issue concern is the state of democracy and they link Trump and Republicans with antisemitic forces, support for Israel does not provide cover for Members of Congress who deny Biden's 2020 victory.
 - 72 percent disapprove of AIPAC's endorsement of pro-Israel Members of Congress who voted against the certification of the 2020 Presidential election.


- Numerous measures demonstrate that Jewish voters have concerns over certain Israeli government policies, and they overwhelmingly support American efforts to help resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.
 - 89 percent say that someone can be both "pro-Israel" and critical of Israeli government policy.
 - 73 percent support the U.S. exerting pressure on both Israelis and Palestinians to make compromises to achieve peace.
 - 69 percent support a comprehensive 2-state peace agreement that is based on the 1967 borders, makes Palestinian neighborhoods in Jerusalem part of the Palestinian state while Israel retains control of Jerusalem's Jewish neighborhoods, and allows some Palestinian refugees to return to Israel.
 - 68 percent support restricting U.S. assistance, so it is not spent on activities that expand West Bank occupation.
 - A majority believe Israel should suspend all settlement construction (37 percent) or build only in areas that are already developed (39 percent).
 - Benjamin Netanyahu is very unpopular (33 percent favorable/59 percent unfavorable).

- Jewish voters strongly support the U.S. re-entering the Iran nuclear agreement (71 percent).
- Trump is seen by 83 percent as more responsible for America's withdrawal from the agreement, compared to only 17 percent who think the Iranian regime is more responsible.


Demographic Overview






Jewish Electorate: Highly Identifies As Democratic & Liberal/Progressive












Democrats Retain Jewish Bump After Trump Became Leading GOP Figure



Democrats Win Across Gender & Age; Particularly Dominant Among Women & Older Voters









Responsibility: Rise in White Supremacy








Broad Disapproval Of AIPAC's Support For Members Of Congress Who Opposed 2020 Presidential Certification

AIPAC Endorsement Policy









As you may know, on a few occasions during the past several years, Israeli, Palestinian, and American negotiators came close to reaching a final status peace agreement but ultimately fell short.

The details of that agreement include:

- A demilitarized Palestinian state in the West Bank and Gaza
- Internationally recognized borders based on the borders that existed in 1967, with mutually agreed land swaps that allow for most Jewish settlers in the West Bank to be inside Israel while the Palestinians get comparable land areas in return
- Palestinian neighborhoods in Jerusalem become part of the new Palestinian state while Israel retains control of Jewish neighborhoods and the Western Wall in Jerusalem
- International forces to monitor the new Palestinian state and border crossings
- Financial compensation for Palestinian refugees while allowing some refugees to return to Israel if they meet specific family reunification criteria and the Israeli government approves




In your opinion, which of the following would be the best resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict?




Establishing one state that is neither Jewish nor Palestinian, and includes Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza under a single government elected by Israelis and Palestinians

Israeli annexation of the West Bank that establishes one state as the national homeland of the Jewish people, and allows Palestinians to vote for their municipal leaders but not vote for Israel's national government

Establishing two separate states with their own separate governments – a Jewish State of Israel alongside an Arab State of Palestine

Large Majority Oppose Expanding Settlements




Israel should suspend all construction of Israeli settlements in the West Bank

Iran Nuclear Agreement


Iran Agreement






Broad Support For Re-Entering Agreement
