WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: MINISTERS BEZALEL SMOTRICH AND I ITAMAR BEN-GVIR

FINANCE MINISTER BEZALEL SMOTRICH:

J STREET

1) Smotrich is driving the Netanyahu government's "stealth annexation" of the West Bank.

- Smotrich leads the far-right, pro-settlement Religious Zionism Party and openly calls for "winning and ending" the battle to prevent a two-state solution through "victory by settlement." As Finance Minister and a minister in the Defense Ministry, he has used the vast governing responsibilities in the West Bank, <u>transferred</u> to him in May by the IDF, to pursue "<u>stealthy</u>" annexation.
- Smotrich has <u>seized</u> the largest amount of Palestinian land in 30 years and ramped up Palestinian home demolitions. He has also approved plans to <u>legalize</u> outposts and <u>construct</u> thousands of new settlement homes.
- Smotrich co-founded the pro-settler organization <u>Regavim</u> in 2006, "<u>half the people</u> he has brought into the Defense Ministry are from Regavim," including the <u>head</u> of the Settlement Administration.

2) Smotrich incites settler violence against Palestinians in the West Bank.

- Smotrich called to "<u>wipe out</u>" the West Bank Palestinian town of Huwara following a <u>settler pogrom</u> in February 2023 which left one Palestinian dead, more than 100 injured, and the town ablaze.
- Smotrich has threatened to turn the West Bank "into ruins," and labeled claims of settler violence an "antisemitic lie."

3) Smotrich is waging financial war on the Palestinian Authority and West Bank economy.

 Smotrich has leveraged his position to deliberately <u>weaken</u> the Palestinian Authority (PA) and <u>West Bank economy</u> – thereby <u>bolstering</u> Hamas, which he called an "asset" in delegitimizing Palestinians and undermining a two-state solution. These steps include <u>withholding</u> Palestinian tax revenues and threatening to <u>cut off</u> Palestinian banks from Israel's financial system.

4) Smotrich supports permanent Israeli control of Gaza, rebuilding settlements there, forcing the transfer of Palestinian civilians, and withholding humanitarian aid.

- Smotrich <u>supports</u> permanent Israeli occupation of Gaza and the "<u>voluntary emigration</u>" of Palestinian civilians from the Strip. In January, Smotrich <u>attended</u> a far-right conference in support of the resettlement of Gaza.
- Smotrich <u>blocked</u> a US-funded shipment of flour from entering Gaza, and also <u>defended</u> the leader of the <u>US-sanctioned</u> Tzav 9 group, which led attacks on humanitarian aid convoys en route to Gaza.

5) Smotrich was jailed in 2005 for attempting to blow up a highway while protesting Israel's disengagement from Gaza.

• Smotrich was arrested on suspicion of "<u>endangering human life</u>," and dubbed a "<u>Jewish terrorist</u>" by the then-deputy head of the Shin Bet.

6) Smotrich is considered a religious extremist within Israel.

- Smotrich, a <u>self-described</u> "fascist homophobe," organized a Kahanist "<u>Beast Parade</u>" in 2006, marching with goats and donkeys to protest the Pride Parade in Jerusalem.
- Smotrich supports a <u>halakhic state</u> in which Israel is governed by Torah law. Accordingly, he has <u>derided</u> non-Orthodox Jews, <u>discriminated</u> against Arabs, and <u>opposed</u> women serving in the IDF and legislation to combat violence against women.

NATIONAL SECURITY MINISTER ITAMAR BEN-GVIR:

1) Ben-Gvir is a chief inciter of settler violence in the West Bank.

- Ben-Gvir, who leads the ultranationalist Jewish Power Party has defended violent settlers as "sweet kids," shielded them from accountability, and downplayed their deadly violence as mere "graffiti." The chief of Israel's Shin Bet intelligence service has called out Ben-Gvir for fuelling "Jewish terror."
- Ben-Gvir has <u>armed</u> violent settlers in the West Bank with 10,000 assault rifles, and the settlers who carried out the latest pogrom in the Palestinian town of Jit reportedly <u>identified</u> themselves as "Ben-Gvir's gang."

2) Ben-Gvir supports West Bank settlement expansion and annexation.

- Visiting the illegal West Bank outpost of Evyatar in June 2023, Ben-Gvir told settlers to "run for the hilltops, settle them."
- Responding to the recent International Court of Justice <u>ruling</u> on the illegality of West Bank occupation, Ben-Gvir called for <u>annexing large parts</u> of the territory.

3) Ben-Gvir's inflammatory violations of the status quo on the Temple Mount could further destabilize the region.

- Ben-Gvir is pushing to <u>change</u> the long-standing status quo on the Temple Mount to allow for Jewish prayer and build a synagogue atop the Muslim holy site.
- Ben-Gvir's visits to the Temple Mount in <u>May</u> and <u>July</u> were roundly condemned, including by the Jordanian custodians of the Temple Mount and the State Department, as "<u>counterproductive</u> to achieving peace and stability."

4) Ben-Gvir incited violence before Rabin's murder and was convicted by an Israeli court for supporting terrorism.

- Shortly before the assassination of Yitzhak Rabin in 1995, Ben-Gvir <u>threatened</u> the prime minister on live television. In 2008, Ben-Gvir was <u>convicted</u> for supporting the Kahanist terrorist organization, Kach, and was <u>deemed unfit</u> for military service.
- Ben-Gvir <u>displayed</u> a portrait in his living room of Kahanist terrorist Baruch Goldstein, who in 1994 killed 29 Palestinian Muslim worshippers at the Tomb of the Patriarchs in Hebron.

5) Ben-Gvir wants to stop aid to Gaza, expel Palestinian civilians, and resettle the Strip.

- Ben-Gvir <u>ordered</u> his police force to stop providing security for humanitarian aid convoys en route to Gaza, and advocated for <u>cutting</u> all humanitarian aid to the Strip.
- Ben-Gvir <u>attended</u> a Gaza resettlement conference alongside Smotrich, and has also <u>called</u> for the "voluntary departure of Gaza's residents."

6) Ben-Gvir is weaponizing the police against Israeli hostage families and pro-democracy protesters within Israel, and against Palestinians in the West Bank.

- Ben-Gvir has ordered a violent <u>crackdown</u> on Jewish and non-Jewish protesters, including <u>family</u> <u>members</u> of hostages still in Gaza, leading to widespread injuries and mass arrests.
- Ben-Gvir has <u>encouraged</u> Border Police to shoot any "terrorist" even if they do not pose a threat and purposely <u>worsened</u> prison conditions for Palestinians.
